Sundays Against Slavery

Christians were instrumental in building the moral consensus that led to slavery being outlawed worldwide. The job now is to eradicate modern forms of this crime against humanity. Here are ways the Christian community has become engaged in the fight against modern-day slavery.

Christian Leaders Taking Action

United States Conference of Catholic Bishops: The USCCB has launched a comprehensive anti-human trafficking campaign through which they conduct research as to the effectiveness of existing aftercare programs for survivors, educate the public and raise awareness about slavery, and provide employment services to victims and survivors of trafficking. Faith Alliance Against Slavery and Trafficking: FAAST, a Christian nonprofit alliance, works to raise awareness about slavery and trafficking, as well as provide the tools and trainings necessary for community members to make a difference. They developed a comprehensive curriculum called *Hands that Heal: International Curriculum to Train Caregivers of Trafficking Survivors* to educate communities in serving victims of human trafficking. For Small Group or Bible Study Leaders

Community Supper (Mission + A Meal): Host a community supper at your church, home or local restaurant. Ask a local food vendor to donate a meal and invite other small groups, friends and family to hear about Free the Slaves' mission - to liberate slaves around the world & change the conditions that allow slavery to persist - and how the church can help. Attendees can make a donation to the organization in place of paying for their meals.

Study on Modern Slavery + the Bible's Call to Action: Take three to four weeks to lead your group in a study of modern-day slavery and the Bible's teachings on freedom, justice and compassion for this issue. You could assign some readings from one of Free the Slaves co-founder Kevin Bales' books www.freetheslaves.net/books and refer to biblical scriptures and stories that lead to reflection, discussion and action.

Communities for Communities: Free the Slaves supports more than 1,000 community groups to achieve and sustain freedom in slavery hot spot countries. Slavery is such a large injustice that it can often seem like too big a problem to tackle. We invite your small group to support a village through the act of prayer. Guided by the scripture Matthew 18:19, lead your group in praying specifically for one of the communities Free the Slaves works in. Matthew 18:19 – "Again I say to you, if two of you agree on earth about anything they ask, it will be done for them by my Father in heaven."

Fund an Abolitionist: Free the Slaves works on the ground to help rescue and reintegrate those in slavery, and to cut-off slavery at the source. Organize a fundraiser or donate to help us pay the salary of a liberator who risks his or her life to go on the frontlines and rescue slaves. Join or Start a Small Group Focused on the Study of Modern-day Slavery:
