How We Work

Protecting Women and Girls

We promote women's empowerment by educating villagers about women's rights, organizing self-help groups, providing vocational training to women and formal schooling for girls, and ensuring that women's voices are heard.



We teach parents about the rights of children and establish systems to rescue, shelter and rehabilitate enslaved children — breaking the cycle of child exploitation. We even form child rights clubs in schools so kids can speak up for themselves.

Improving Livelihoods

We improve economic resilience for families by providing tools, training and capital to start microenterprises — including sewing machines, barbering

and hairdressing equipment, candle making and handicraft supplies — even cows, goats and honeybees for farming.











Strengthening Socioeconomic Security

We increase access to essential community services — such as education, health care, vocational training and savings clubs — that act as counterbalances to the vulnerabilities that lead to slavery. Physical and social wellbeing improve.

Advancing Global Advocacy

We help community leaders press for better police protection and train officers how to gather evidence and arrest traffickers. We work with public officials

to strengthen laws and increase spending on antitrafficking programs. We serve in leadership roles in U.S. and U.N. coalitions and convene global gatherings of anti-trafficking experts and activists.

The Freedom Dividend

Free the Slaves tears down barriers that separate the enslaved from dignified, fulfilling lives. When people break free under our community-based approach, their entire village or neighborhood becomes slavery-free and slavery-resistant. Systemic change delivers a better life for all.
